Bill Ayers, Ph.D. is an American elementary education leader who has been a social justice activist since the 1960s, when he became known for his anti-war efforts. Dr. Ayers is currently a professor in the College of Education at the University of Illinois at Chicago, holding the titles of Distinguished Professor of Education and Senior University Scholar. His current academic work focuses on education reform, curriculum, and instruction, with a lens of social justice and equity. He remains actively involved in political and social movements.
